The Friends cannot accept VHS tapes, textbooks, encyclopedias, Reader's Digest Condensed collections or magazines.

Residents should bring their

boxed or bagged donations to the library circulation desk or leave them in the library foyer. It would be most helpful for the staff if townspeople could use boxes or bags to place donations in so they can be left at the library. The library is accepting donations right up until a week before the sale. Donation receipts are available upon request.
